## **UNALASKA COVID-19 CASE COUNT:**

NEW CASES (all Industry Related)30
CURRENT ACTIVE CASES53
Industry Related52
Community Acquired 1
CUMULATIVE COVID Tests Performed Locally7,206
CUMULATIVE Positive Persons Tested Locally437

We presently have 53 active cases, 1 of which has been moved from Industry Related to Community Acquired based on new information. It is felt that this Community Acquired case is isolated and poses limited risk to the community at large. Therefore, based on the Emergency Response Plan, Unalaska Unified Command is pleased to reduce our Local Risk Factor to **MEDIUM**.

**SPECIAL CITY COUNCIL MEETING:** Due to the reduction of the Local Risk Factor to **MEDIUM**, the Unalaska City Council has called a Special Meeting for Thursday, February 11, 2021, at 6:00 p.m. to consider revisions to the ongoing measures to protect public health.

**STATE OF ALASKA CASE COUNT:** Today we report 329 new cases, 5 new hospitalizations and 1 new death since the News Release issued on Monday.

**NEW COVID MANDATE:** Last evening the Unalaska City Council adopted a new local mandate containing measures to protect the public health, which is effective at noon today and expires at noon on February 24, 2021. The local mandate, Resolution 2021-09, is largely the same as previous mandates, with additions and clarifications related to the State Ferry and Marine Tourism. Summary of Unalaska's Measures to Protect Public Health:

- State Orders: Everyone is to follow State of Alaska Health Outbreak Orders
- **Face Coverings:** Coverings over the nose and mouth are required of customers and visitors of businesses and organizations, as well as employees and volunteers serving customers.
- Public Indoor Gathering Limitations:
  - Gatherings are meetings or events that bring together people from multiple households

- Limit to 10 people
- Face coverings required
- Maintain 6 foot social distancing between household groups

## O EXCEPTIONS:

- School District limited to 50% of classroom occupancy or 10 people per room, whichever is greater pursuant to their State Smart Start 2020 Plan
- Bars and restaurants limited to 35% maximum occupancy or 10 people per room, whichever is greater; tables must be 6 feet apart, and no more than 5 people per table; sit down service only, no bar or rail service
- Places of worship limited to 35% of maximum occupancy or 10 people per room, whichever is greater
- 14 Day Traveler Self Quarantine: Anyone traveling into the City by vessel or airplane must selfquarantine and monitor for symptoms, with limited exceptions. The rules for quarantine are set out in the mandate. The 14 Day Quarantine must be observed, whether or not the traveler has received a negative test for COVID-19, or been released from care by a health care provider.
- Alaska Residents Traveling on State Ferry for Critical Personal Needs: Travelers from other
  Alaskan communities, traveling to Unalaska on the Alaska Marine Highway System for critical
  personal needs, are exempt from certain portions of the Travel Quarantine, in that they may enter
  stores or businesses for critical personal needs. When not engaged in meeting critical personal
  needs, ferry travelers are required to follow self-quarantine requirements.
- Marine Tourism: Marine tourism passengers and providers are required to adhere to resolutions, ordinances, orders of the City Manager, or any other local mandates related to public safety during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Community and Workforce Protective Plans: Business that are required to submit community and workforce protective plans to the State of Alaska must submit those plans to the City if their employees are traveling here.
- **Protective Protocols:** All business open to the public in Unalaska / Dutch Harbor must post their basic measures to protect the public health on the doors to the business.
- **Penalties:** Violation of local order is punishable as a misdemeanor under Unalaska Code of Ordinances § 2.96.090 and is a Public Nuisance, subject to the remedies in UCO § 11.08 including prosecution as a minor offense.

**COVID VACCINE, NEW ELIGIBILITY TIER:** The state has released the opening of the next vaccine eligibility tier, which begins tomorrow at noon. Alaskans currently eligible to receive the COVID vaccine include people age 65 and over and most health care workers. Starting February 11, people in these categories are eligible to schedule vaccine appointments:

- People 50 years and above with a high-risk medical condition\*
- People 50 years and above working as a frontline essential worker\*
- Pre K–12 and child care education staff
- People living or working in congregate settings\*
