UPDATED LOCAL COVID MANDATE: Yesterday the Unalaska City Council revised the local COVID mandate (Resolution 2021-15). Due to updated guidance provided by the CDC, council removed the 3-month window exempting fully vaccinated individuals from the traveler quarantine, meaning that *individuals fully vaccinated are not required to quarantine upon arrival in Unalaska.* Council also removed the three passenger limit for taxicabs. The new mandate is effective at noon today through noon on April 14, 2021, and is on the City website at https://www.ci.unalaska.ak.us/citymanager/page/local-mandates

HELP STOP THE PANDEMIC – GET VACCINATED! Everyone who is age 16 and above, living or working in Alaska, is eligible to receive the vaccine. Call the IFHS Clinic at 581-1202 or the Q-Tribe at 581-2920 to schedule your vaccine appointment.

- The vaccine is effective to keep you from getting COVID-19
- Even if you do get COVID-19, the vaccine will help keep you from getting seriously ill
- You are considered fully vaccinated two weeks after receiving the vaccine, so continue to protect yourself while your body builds immunity
- After you are fully vaccinated, you can start doing some of the things you stopped doing because
 of the pandemic, such as
 - O Gathering indoors with other fully vaccinated people, without face coverings
 - O Gathering indoors with unvaccinated people from one other household, without face coverings (unless anyone is at increased risk of severe illness from COVID-19)
 - If you've been exposed to COVID-19, you do not need to isolate or get tested, unless you have symptoms
- After you are fully vaccinated, you are exempt from Unalaska's travel quarantine!
- Because health officials are still learning how vaccines will affect the spread of COVID-19, after you've been fully vaccinated, you should keep taking precautions in public places like wearing a mask, staying 6 feet apart from others, and avoiding large crowds and poorly ventilated spaces until we know more

UNALASKA COVID-19 CASE COUNT: Case categories indicate where a person was most likely exposed to or acquired the virus.

STATE OF ALASKA CASE COUNT: Reporting 399 new cases statewide, 18 new hospitalizations and 2 additional deaths since the March 22 news release.
