REMAIN DILIGENT! Today we report another large increase in confirmed cases in the State of Alaska, with widespread community transmission. City Manager Erin Reinders and IFHS Clinic Director Melanee Tiura again take this opportunity to urge everyone to remain diligent in following these protective measures to limit the spread of the virus:

- Wash Your Hands Frequently
- Don't Touch Your Face
- Clean & Disinfect Surfaces Daily
- Wear Face Covering in Public (required in businesses)
- Cover Coughs and Sneezes
- Keep 6 feet from Other People
- Keep Your Social Circle Small

- Avoid: large gatherings; being in enclosed spaces with others; long interactions with non-household members; being around forceful exhalations like yelling and singing
- No Close Contact with Sick Persons
- Watch for Symptoms & get tested if you develop symptoms
