BALLOT QUESTION 1

Should the Unalaska Code of Ordinances be amended to provide exceptions to the power of the City Manager and the City Council to act in the case of a declared epidemic disaster, at Chapter 2.96.030, by adding subpart (E), as follows?

(E) Notwithstanding any grant of authority provided under this Chapter, exceptions to the authority of the City Manager and the City Council to act under this Chapter are as follows:

(1) Where a declared disaster emergency involves an actual or threatened epidemic, neither the City Manager nor the City Council has authority to issue statutes, ordinances, orders, laws, regulations, or resolutions, or to extend resolutions that authorize:

- the seizure or quarantining of any person absent a court order;
- the seizure or commandeering of any real estate, personal property, asset, resource, or commodity that is privately owned absent a court order;
- the closure of any private business operation absent a court order;
- limiting the hours of business operations absent a court order;
- limiting the public capacity of any private business that is less than the lawful capacity for that building absent a court order;
- limiting the size of private gatherings absent a court order;
- directing that citizens must wear protective facemasks in any private or public place, except that facemasks may be mandated for persons entering a building that serves a function for the municipality; or
- impinging a citizen's constitutional rights to peaceably assemble and to petition the government.

Should the Unalaska Code of Ordinances be amended to provide exceptions to the power of the Director of Emergency Preparedness to act in the case of a declared epidemic disaster, at Chapter 2.96.040, by adding subpart (12), as follows?

(12) Notwithstanding any grant of authority provided under this Chapter, exceptions to the authority of the Director of Emergency Preparedness to act under this Chapter are as follows:

(a) Where a declared disaster emergency involves an actual or threatened epidemic, the Director of Emergency Preparedness does not have authority to issue statutes, ordinances, orders, laws, regulations, or proclamations that authorize:

- the seizure or quarantining of any person absent a court order;
- the seizure or commandeering of any real estate, personal property, asset, resource, or commodity that is privately owned absent a court order;
- the closure of any private business operation absent a court order;
- limiting the hours of business operations absent a court order;
- limiting the public capacity of any private business that is less than the lawful capacity for that building absent a court order;
- limiting the size of private gatherings absent a court order;
- directing that citizens must wear protective facemasks in any private or public place, except that facemasks may be mandated for persons entering a building that serves a function for the municipality; or
- impinging a citizen's constitutional rights to peaceably assemble and to petition the government.
