

<u>City of Unalaska Legislative Report</u> <u>2/26/23</u>

We are on 1/3rd of the way through the legislative session in Juneau, time is flying but things in the capital seem to be moving at a slower pace. The increasing number of folks falling ill has not helped.

The finance committees in both chambers are wrapping up the operations finance sub committees and will continue the questioning and analysis of the Governor's budget proposals in more detail. As normal, legislators will make efforts to add their own capital projects over the course of the budget process. As of now, we are potentially facing a \$400 million dollar deficit.

In her annual address to the Alaska Legislature, Sen. Lisa Murkowski urged state lawmakers to avoid spending too much time on the amount of this year's Permanent Fund dividend and to focus on problems causing people to move out of the state. She said folks should be looking at issues such as, childcare, transportation, housing, workforce shortages and economic development.

On Thursday Governor Dunleavy launched a new energy task force to review the state's overall energy policies. His vision is that this group will develop a comprehensive statewide energy plan that will evaluate energy generation, distribution, cost, and transmission for the state of Alaska and its communities.

There has been much focus on the State of Alaska's 401(k)-style retirement system for new employees, it is providing significantly smaller benefits than the pensionstyle retirement system discontinued in 2006, according to a new analysis from the state Division of Retirement and Benefits. A detailed analysis was presented Thursday to the Senate Finance Committee, as legislators are considering whether to revive a pension for new employees as a way to encourage recruitment and retention.
