Overview:

Governor Dunleavy introduced a supplemental budget this week requesting an additional \$262.5 million. It is said to be the largest supplemental that folks can remember. If approved, it will allow access to \$225 million in federal matching funds bring the total to \$507.9 million.

Big ticket items:

- \$110.5 million in State funds to cover last summer's wildfire damage in Southcentral and the Interior
- \$3 million in State funds for infrastructure repairs due to the earthquake
- 128 million in State funds for Medicaid services
- \$6.7 million to hire new troopers, wildlife troopers and trooper equipment
- \$1.0 million in State funds for Pioneer Homes Payment Assistance Programs
- \$6 million in State funds to reach full capacity for the Alaska Psychiatric Institute
- 12.5 million in Marine Highway Receipts for the Alaska Marine Highway System

The Department of Transportation announced this week that Alaska Marine Highway System's (AMHS) mainline services will be completely shut down due to eleven out of twelve boats being in yard status or broke down. The committee hearings generated many uncomfortable or unanswerable questions for the AMHS leadership. The 12.5M in the supplemental will primarily be used for last year's shortages or unforeseen costs, it does not contain funding for expansion of services. There are many communities struggling to resolve how to get their residents basic life services.

The House finance subcommittee directed AMHS leadership to come up with two scenarios to reduce service gaps by 50 percent and by 100 percent. In the scenarios provided, an additional 7.3M would reduce gaps by 50 percent and 23M reduce gaps by 100 percent. I have included the presentation for your review.

Senator Stedman and Representative Stutes have been appointed to the Governor's AMHS work group.

School Bond Debit Reimbursement continues to be a topic of conversation. Most Legislators seem to be in support of ensuring the State's contribution is covered at 100 percent. As with all things, the question becomes how do we pay for it? In meetings, the conversations continue to hammer on impacts and cost shifting which seems to get folks thinking more about creative solutions.

However, next Friday Senate Finance will be taking up HB 106, former Rep. Tammie Wilson's bill which extends the moratorium on school bond debit reimbursement for 5 years. This could be problematic, particularly, since at this time there is no funding for school construction or major maintenance in the Governor's budget.

Senator Hoffman's SB 74 internet for schools had two hearings in House Finance this week, there seems to potential for passage this session.

SB 115, Senator Bishop's motor tax fuel bill was up for public testimony in Senate Finance this week, while industry associations such as Alaska General Contractors and Alaska Trucking Association offered support, a handful of individuals testified in opposition. This bill also seems to have traction for passage this session.

Representative Hopkins introduced HB 232- Municipal Air, Tax Credit incentives. This bill focuses on air quality improvement by allowing municipalities to provide property tax credits for existing structures that have improved in a way that aids air quality and new construction that provides for energy efficiency.

In the House this week they will be focusing on finance sub-committee close outs.
