Overview:

It really was Friday the 13th ...or maybe all week!

The Governor declared a state of emergency on Wednesday, March 11th, both the House and Senate voted to amend the Mental Health Budget (HB206) to include \$4 million in state funds and \$9 million in federal receipt authority in order to get the infrastructure in place to mitigate the spread of the Coronavirus when it hits Alaska.

On Friday the Alaska State Capital building was closed to the public to limit exposure of the virus, the President declared a national emergency, the price of oil hovered around \$35 per barrel, the stock market hit record lows, the cruise industry announced delays to the cruise ship season and a statewide public-school closure was mandated until, at least, March 30th.

The school closure has many employers and employees scrambling to find other alternatives for childcare. The childcare issue is particularly concerning for those that work in the health care industry.

The State capital will remain closed to the public as long as the virus remains a threat. This means that only lawmakers, employees of the legislature, members of the governor's administration, and credentialed journalists will be permitted into the building. All testimony will need be written or telephonic.

Also, on Friday, Representative Gabrielle LeDoux (Anchorage) was charged with voter misconduct and unlawful interference with voting in the primary and general elections for 2018 and 2014. Her former chief of staff also received similar charges.

If I had to predict the next several weeks, I would venture to guess that the legislature would pass a flat line budget, minus the Permanent Fund Dividend (PFD), and take a recess until the

pandemic surrounding the coronavirus plays out. Then call themselves back to address the PFD. But this really is just my guess!

The legislature's financial analysts provided updates Wednesday on the state's revenue outlooks. The presentation revised revenue estimates based on the plummeting oil prices suggesting that \$40 per barrel would be more accurate than the \$59 per barrel used in the fall forecast. The impact of this new assumption is about \$550 million and that is just the oil market, not factoring in other tax changes due to the coronavirus including interest earned on our permanent fund savings, corporate income tax from the tourism industry, potential impacts to the seafood industry and others to be examined. Overall, they estimated that the deficit in the states budget could grow by more than \$600 million in the upcoming fiscal year beginning July 1st.

The time may truly be ripe for folks to start talking about some form of new revenues.

Several hearings were held in House Finance on the permanent fund restructuring bills, **HB 300** & **HB 306**, including public testimony it continues to be very clear that we do not have a consensus on how the PFD should be restructured, including those who think is should not be changed at all. The hearings for these bills on Friday were canceled and at this point they are not on the schedule for the upcoming week.

SB 115- the motor fuel tax passed out of House Transportation on Thursday with an amendment that would exempt commercial fisherman from the \$.05 increase on marine fuel tax. It does not appear that all parties are in agreement with an exemption for one industry over another. The bill is scheduled to be heard in House Finance on Friday, March 20th.
