City of Unalaska Legislative Report 3/1/22

The 120-day constitutional limit to the session, May 17, will be here quicker than we think. At this point not much has happened in Juneau but that's not unusual. House Finance operating budget subcommittees mostly wrapped up their work last week and will be making reports to the full House Finance committee, which will hold public hearings (probably next weekend) and then make amendments. Look for the operations budget to go to the House floor in about two weeks. Likely a couple of days of debate will be followed on the floor.

The bill then goes to the Senate, which has had its own subcommittees at work. The Senate, is also working on the capital budget, will include some items from the federal infrastructure bill. Information on this is still being rolled out, so how much can be in the capital budget is unclear. The Legislature must authorize federal funds to be received before state agencies can use them. Also, much of the federal money goes directly to institutions outside state government, particularly tribes, much of this will require applications for competitive grants. At this point there is still a lot of unknown.

One of the big difference this session from last session is last year they essentially did not address the dividend issue until the end. This year, they are dealing with it much earlier. With all but one legislator being up for re-election, and this being the second and final session of the Legislature, there is more urgency to get this figured out sooner than later.

What further compounds the issue is rising oil prices. It makes it harder for the legislators who support a smaller dividend and easier for those who support a larger dividend. If oil prices stay in the \$90s, or go higher, Alaska will potentially take in billions of additional revenues this year, above what was previously projected. ANS crude has been above \$90/barrel since January 26. And with all the instability now due to the Russian invasion of Ukraine, the price will likely go even higher.

Keep in mind, Governor Dunleavy's vision is for a 50/50 dividend, plus a supplemental amount to make last year's dividend equal to the 50/50. This combined would be almost \$4,000 per person. While that is unlikely to happen, a \$2,500 dividend, he 50/50 amount that had little traction last year, could be seriously considered this year.

Please consider providing public testimony on bills and budget items that may impact our industry and economy, I will do my best to get you the information as far in advance as possible.
