
### 3. How easy to understand are the local mandates?




5. Have you visited IFHS since the pandemic began (March 15, 2020)?

### a. Did the protective measures, like masking and plexiglass barriers, make you feel safe?







### 9. Have you or a family member travelled to/from Unalaska since the pandemic began (March 15, 2020)?




