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### **Guidelines for Burning**

- A. A permit is not needed:
  - a. If burning is conducted in a barrel no larger than 55 gallons with a screen on top.
  - b. For a barbecue, camp or bon fires no larger than 4' by 4' by 1.5'
    - i. *Example*: A "normal" pallet measures 4' by 4' by 5" so a fire equivalent to three "normal" pallets high would not require a permit.
- B. The issuance of a permit is at the sole discretion of the City of Unalaska's Department of Public Safety.
- C. Burn permits will be issued between the hours of 8:00am and 4:00pm, Monday through Friday. Every effort will be made to have the permit reviewed the same day it was received.
- D. The responsible person listed on the permit shall call Public Safety at (907) 581-1233 prior to and upon completion of burning each day a burn is occurring.
- E. Burning is limited to dates stipulated on the permit (Normally no longer than 1 week).
- F. A copy of the permit shall be in the possession of the fire attendant at the permitted burn site.
- G. All fires shall be monitored at the burn site at all times by a person who is over 18 years of age and all organization approved fire attendants shall be listed on the permit.
- H. Only clean wood, paper, cardboard or organic materials may be burned unless other material is approved and listed on the permit.
- I. Items such as but not limited to treated wood, wood with creosote, plastics, rubber, pallets treated with pesticides, and wood mixed with other materials such as plastics are expressly prohibited from being burned in any permitted burn.
- J. All burning shall be conducted at a minimum of 25 feet from any structure and any combustible materials.
- K. The fire footprint shall not exceed 100 square feet (10' by 10') unless a larger fire is authorized by the permit.
- L. Water based fire suppression devices sufficient to extinguish fire outside the fire footprint shall be available at all times. Geographic and weather based exceptions may be granted by the Division of Fire & EMS on a case by case basis and must be listed on the permit.
- M. Any permit may be revoked if in the judgment of a Public Safety official the continued burning creates a hazardous or offensive condition or if burning is not in compliance with the issued permit.
- N. The Department of Public Safety reserves the right to order a fire of any size or classification extinguished, for any reason, in the interest of public safety.
